Introduction to Isaiah

Background

Time frame: latter half 8th century BC

Regionally / Internationally: Assyrian Empire dominant

Domestically: Israel's two kingdoms

Two Major Events

- 1) Assyrian invasion of Israel
- 2) Assyrian invasion of Judah

Isaiah himself

Son of Amoz

Tradition: nephew of King Amaziah (brother of Amoz) and cousin of King Uzziah

Married, at least two sons:

Shear-jashub *7:3 "a remnant will return"

Maher-Shalal-Hash-Bas *8:1, 3 "quick to the plunder, swift to the spoil"

cf. Is. 8:18

Isaiah's name symbolic of his message: "Yahweh is Salvation"

cf. 45:17

Ministry primarily to Judah

but also to Northern Kingdom (9:8-10:4; 27:1-11; 28:1-6) & to nations (13-23)

Prophetic ministry at least 60 yrs

Apocryphal Assumption of Isaiah → sawn in half during reign of Manasseh

→ **Heb.11:37** ??

Reputation

"King of the Prophets"

"Evangelist of the Old Covenant"

"The Apostle Paul of the OT"

Statesman, Prophet, Poet

Faithful man of deep conviction & unwavering trust in God

Chronological Place among Prophets

Earlier Prophets: Joel, Amos, Hosea, Micah

All others later
